Education level - Middle/High School (12 to 18) - Vocational Training (16 on)	Antonio de Mendoza Secondary School is placed in the neighbourhood called "El Coto" in Alcalá La Real, which is a city in the province of Jaén, Spain. The city has a population of 21,500 inhabitants and it is 71 kilometres (44 minutes) from the provincial capital, Jaén, and 53 kilometres (33 minutes) from Granada. It is located on the slopes of La Mota, a hill in the Sierra Sur. This is commanded by a large Moor fortress around which, until some centuries ago, the settlement revolved. Compulsory Secondary Education (ESO), Vocational Training Qualifications (Cooking) and Adult Education are offered at our school. Since the academic year 2016/2017, we are implementing a Bilingual Programme in English in Year 8 (60 students) and Year 9 (65 students). In Year 10, we count with 4 groups (80 students) and in Year 11 we have other three groups (65 students). We maintain 4 more groups in Vocational Training (Cooking). Adult Education counts with 50 students. There are around 400 students, 42 teachers and other school staff.  The only specific class for students with special needs in the district is in our school, so an extensive number of plans and programmes to cater for diversity are carried out in our school. In fact, this very own

characteristic of our centre -unique in our town- allows us to have a counselling-team and special education teachers who daily work with our students. As a result, many families whose children have these educational needs choose our school for their future. Teachers are highly satisfied by the collaboration obtained from the families in the teaching-learning process and there are many activities that are implemented in conjunction with other schools and local entities of the town. Concerning absenteeism rates, bullying or discrimination, it could be said that there are no problems.
